1	And there was given me a reed like unto a rod: and the angel stood, saying, Rise, and measure the temple of God, and the altar, and them that worship therein.	Then a reed like a rod was given to me, and he said, "Stand up, measure the temple of YHWH , and his ³ altar, and those who worship in it,
2	But the court which is without the temple leave out, and measure it not; for it is given unto the Gentiles: and the holy city shall they tread under foot forty and two months.	but cast out the inner temple, and do not measure <i>it</i> , for it is given to the nations , and they will tread down the set-apart city , forty-two months.
